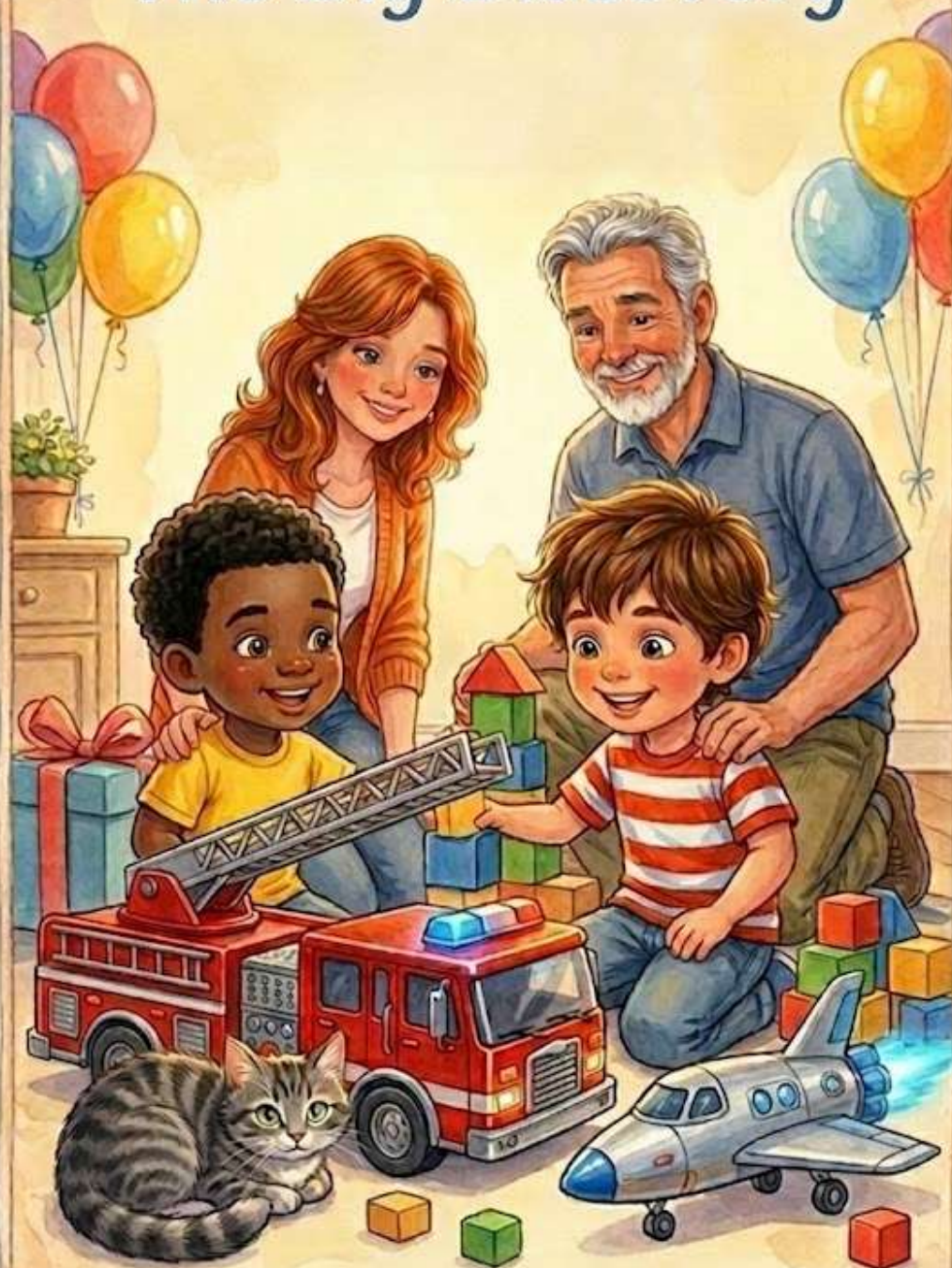

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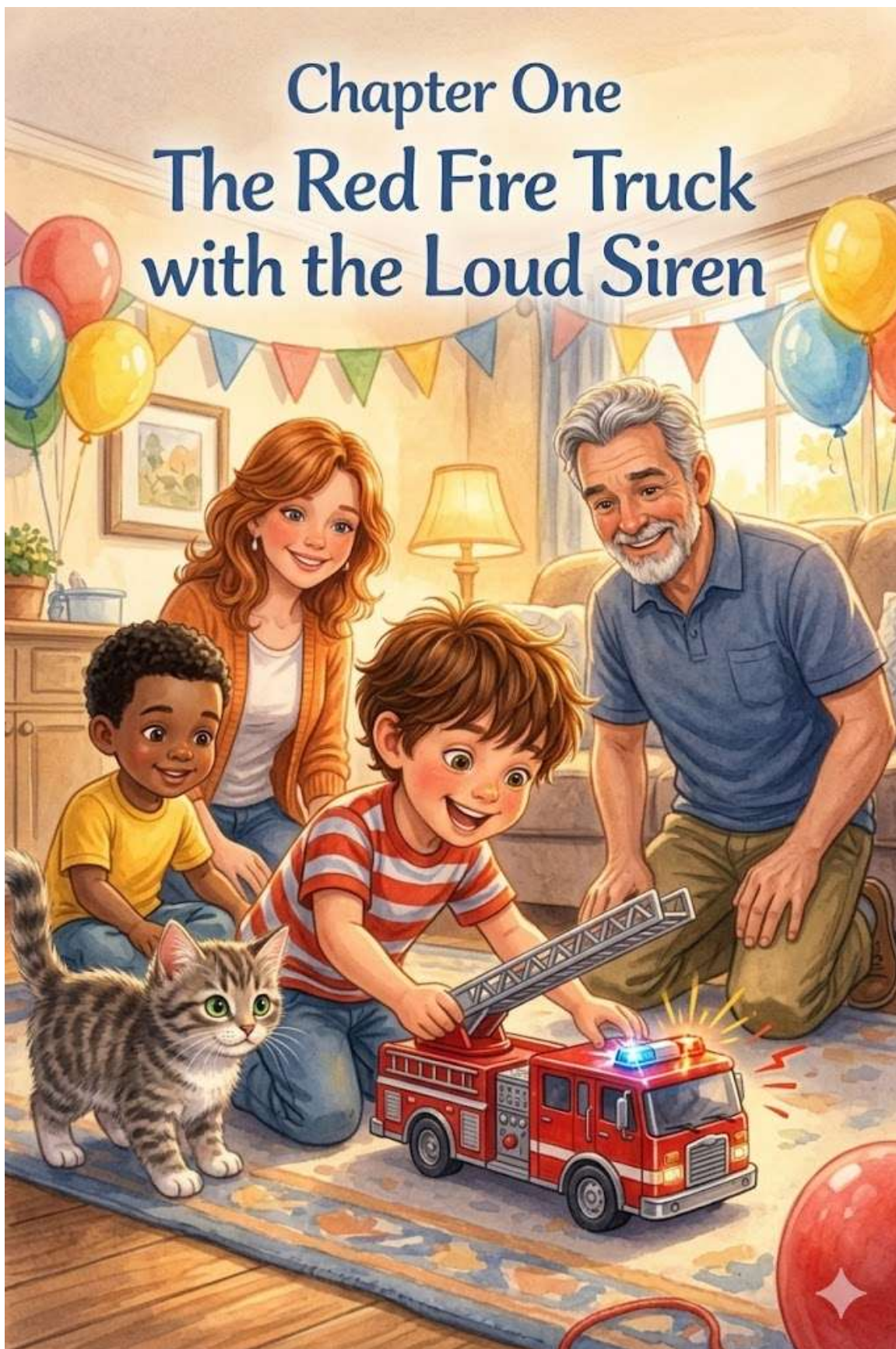
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# Chapter One

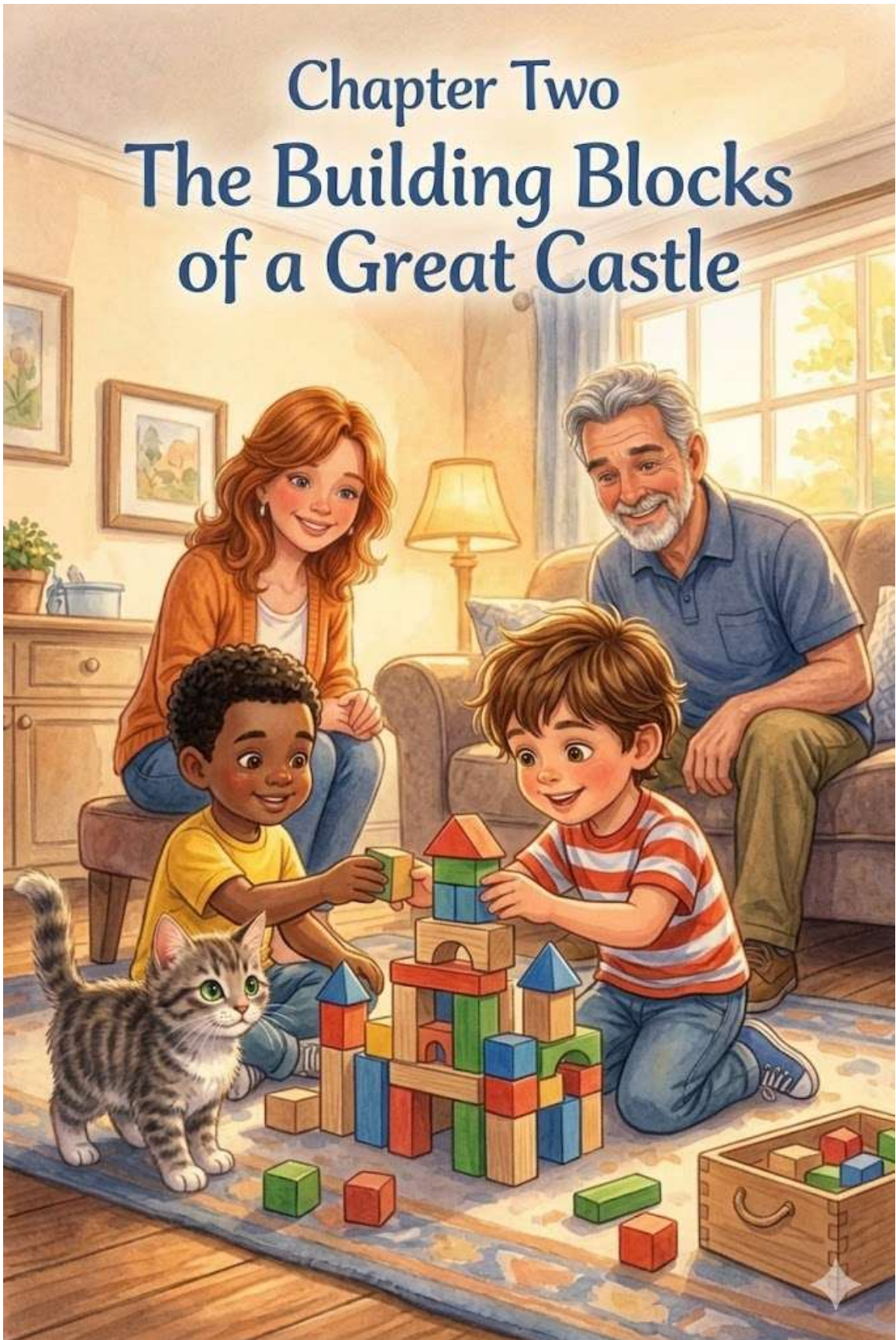
hand instead of a panicked shout, people will always look to you to find the way out of a tough spot, whether it's a mountain or a living room."

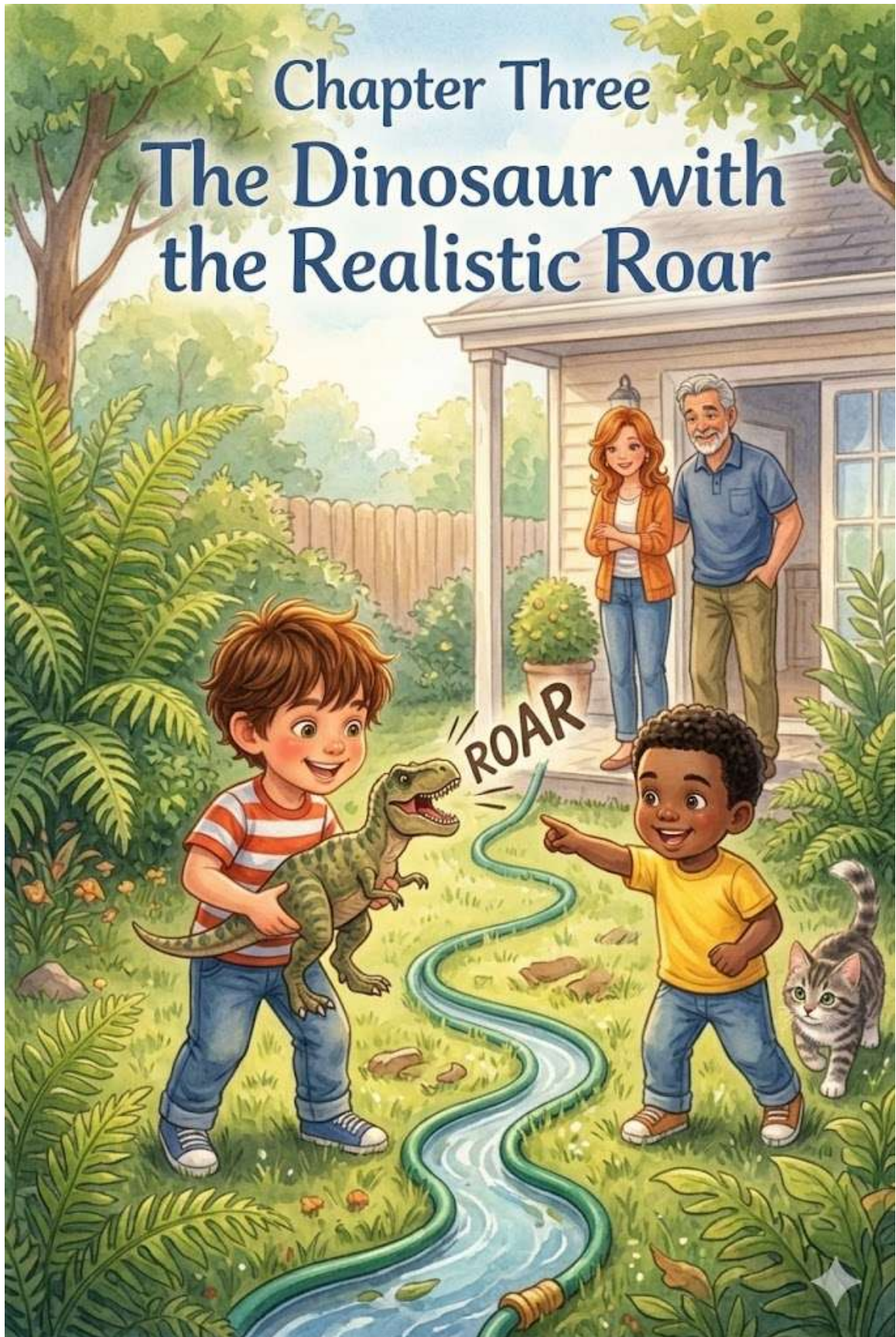

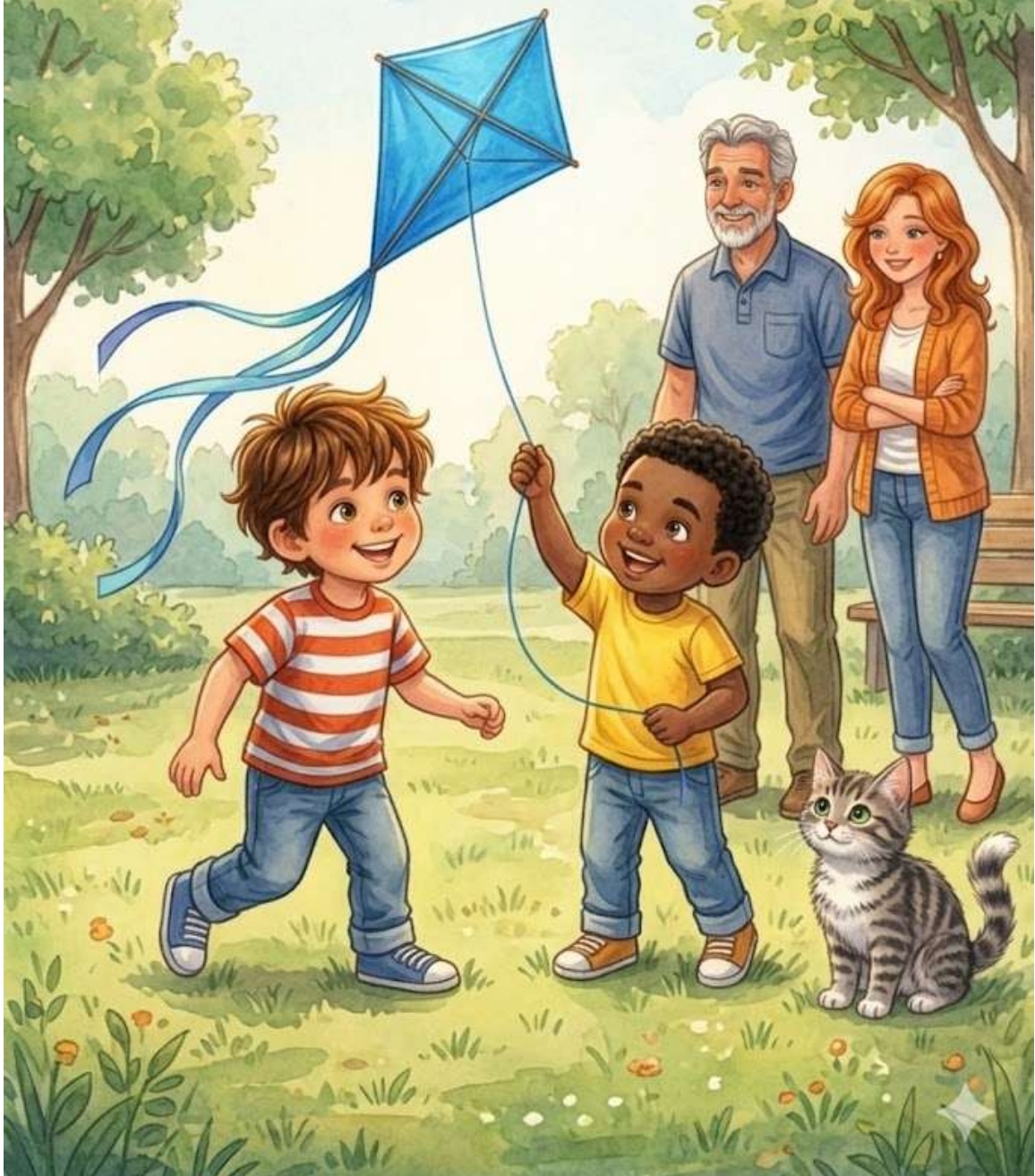

he remembered his "Pre-Flight" lessons and calmly adjusted his position, pulling back until the blue wings found the steady air once again.

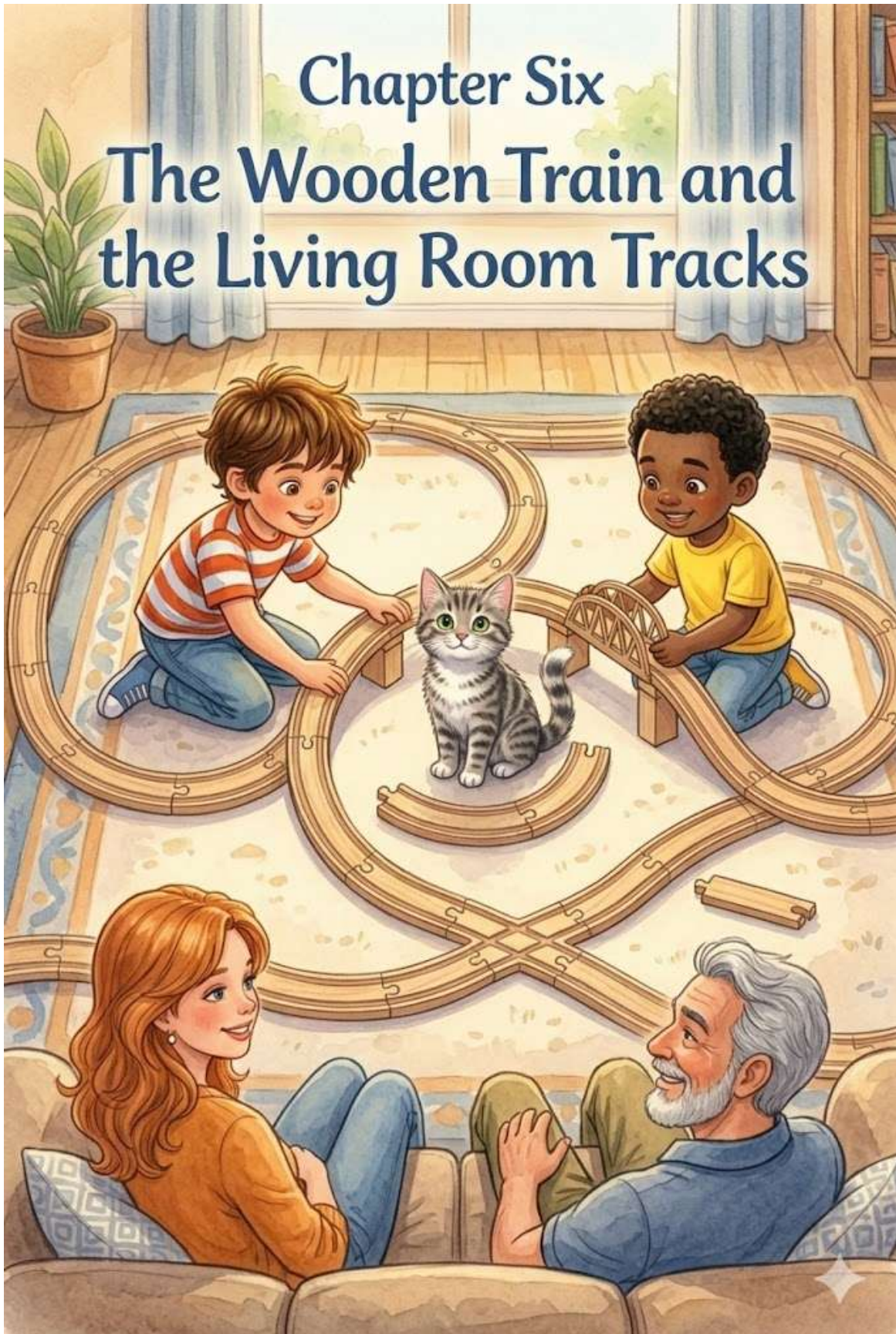

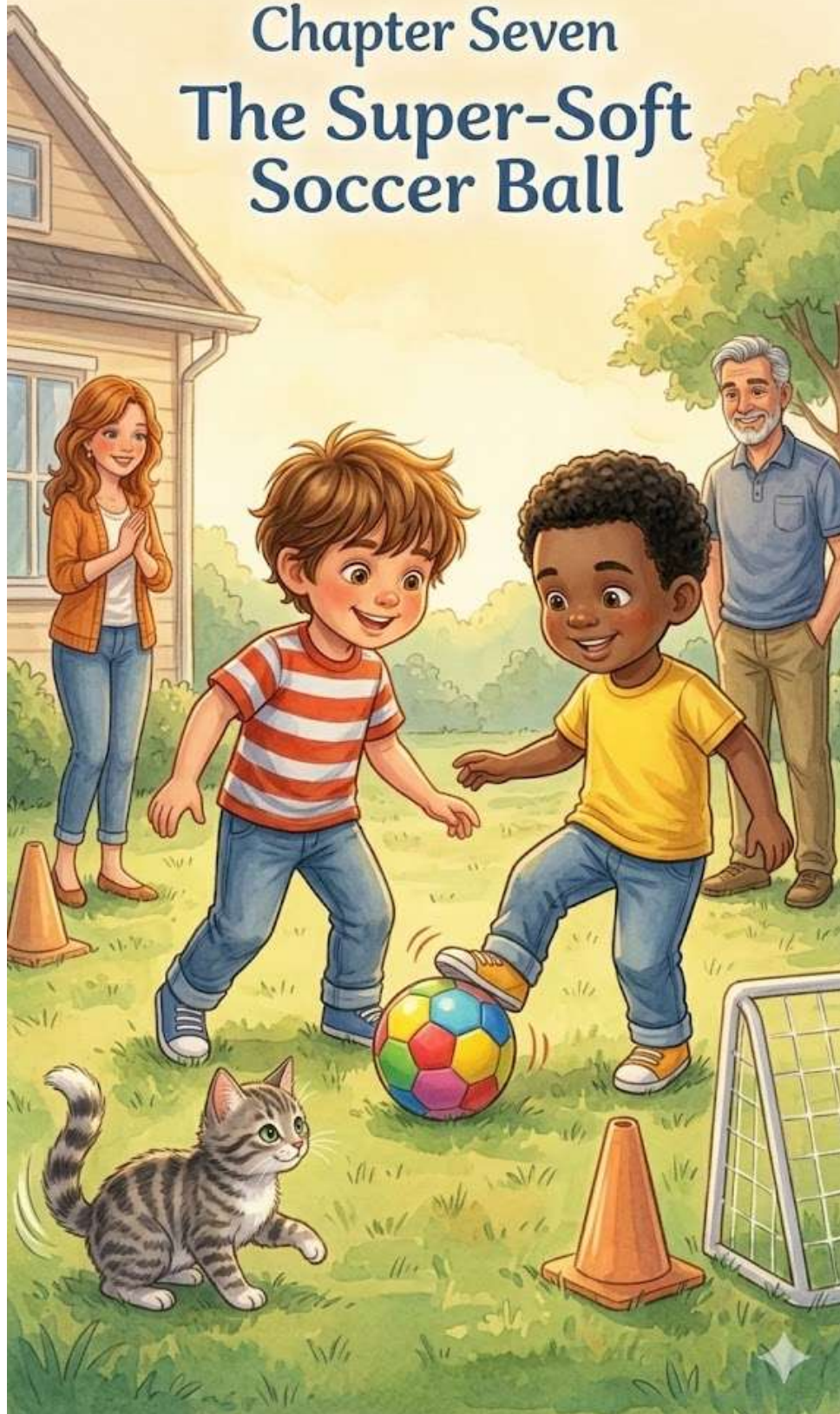

act of compassion—like helping a friend after a tumble—was far more important than finishing a play.

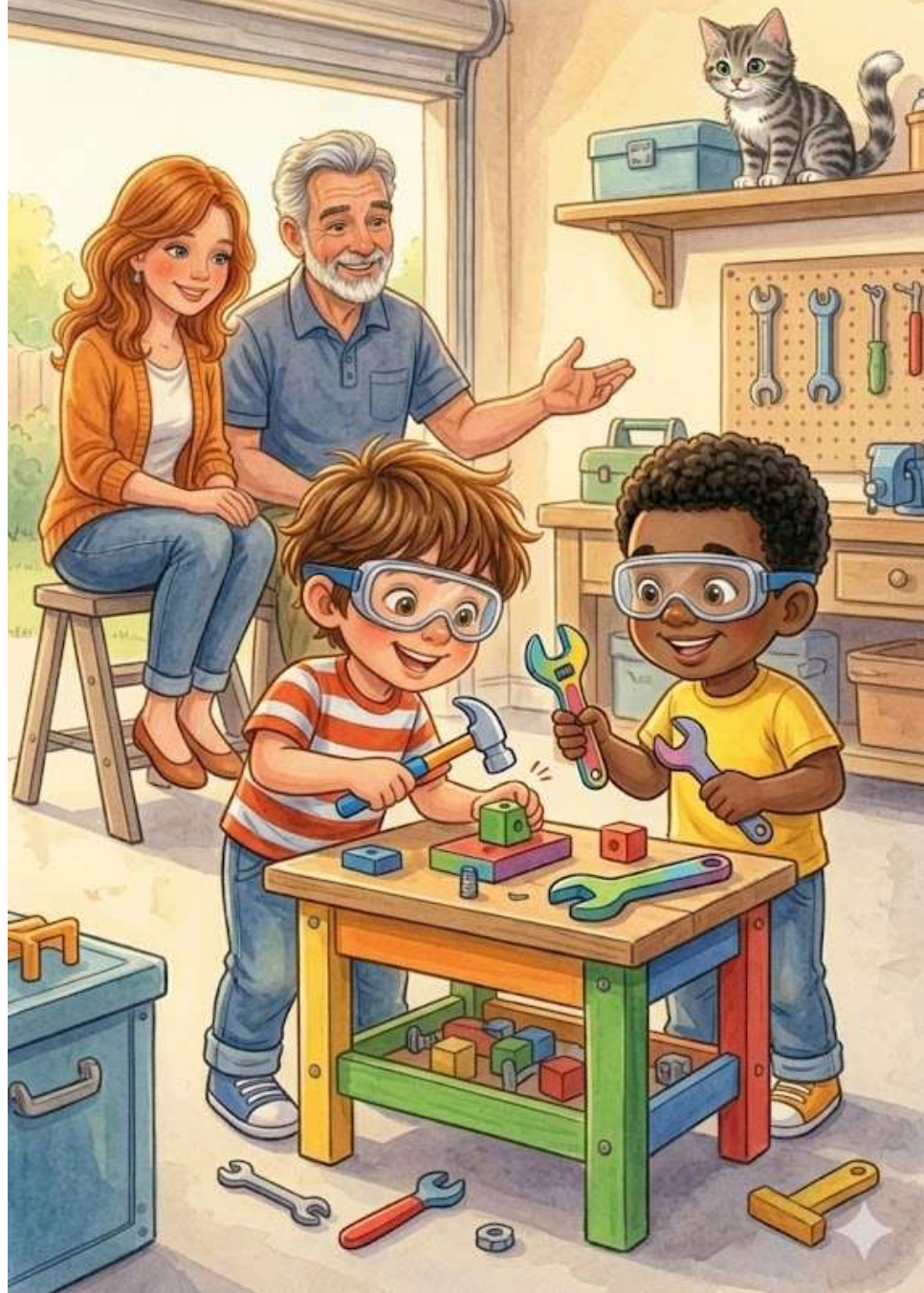

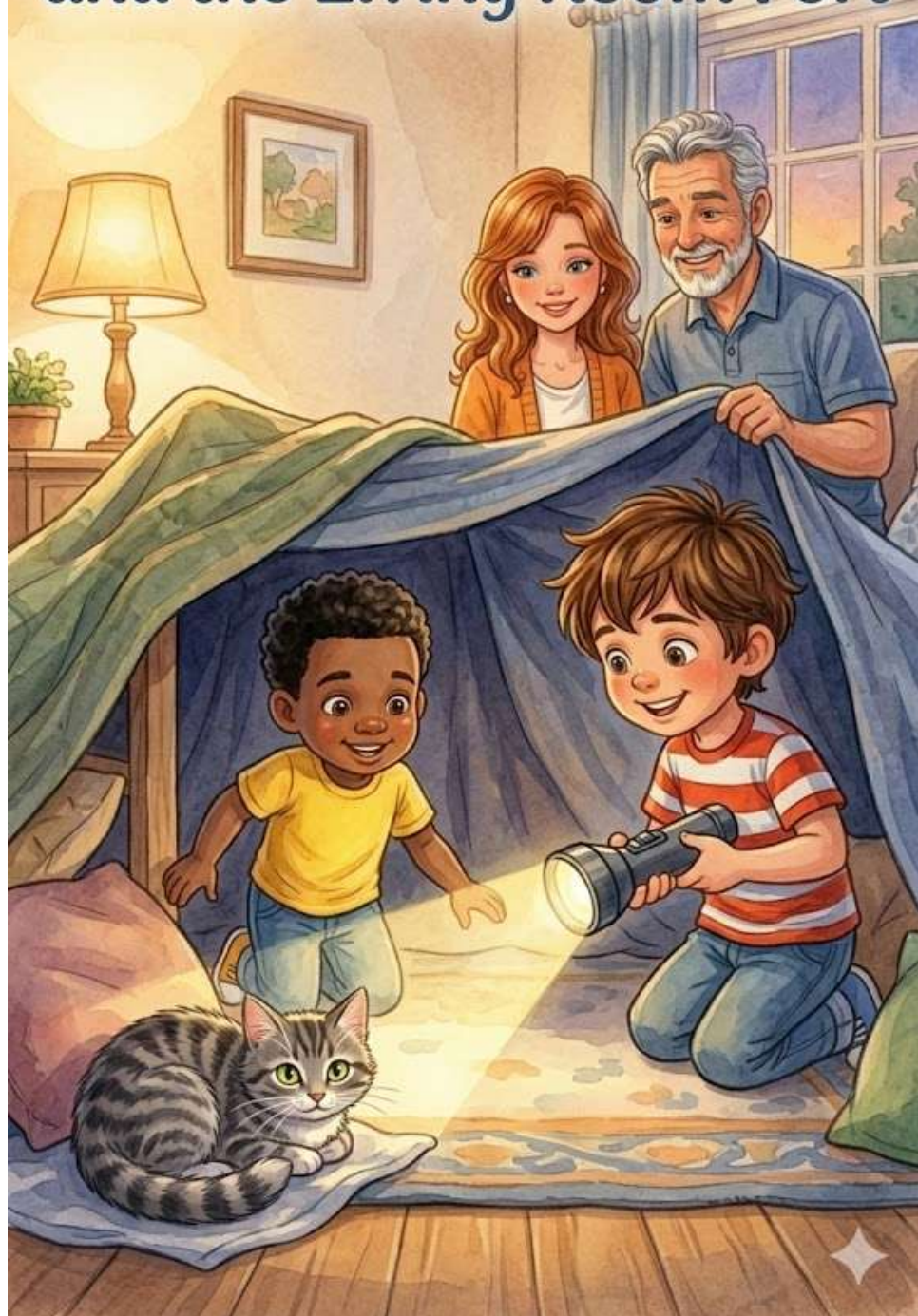

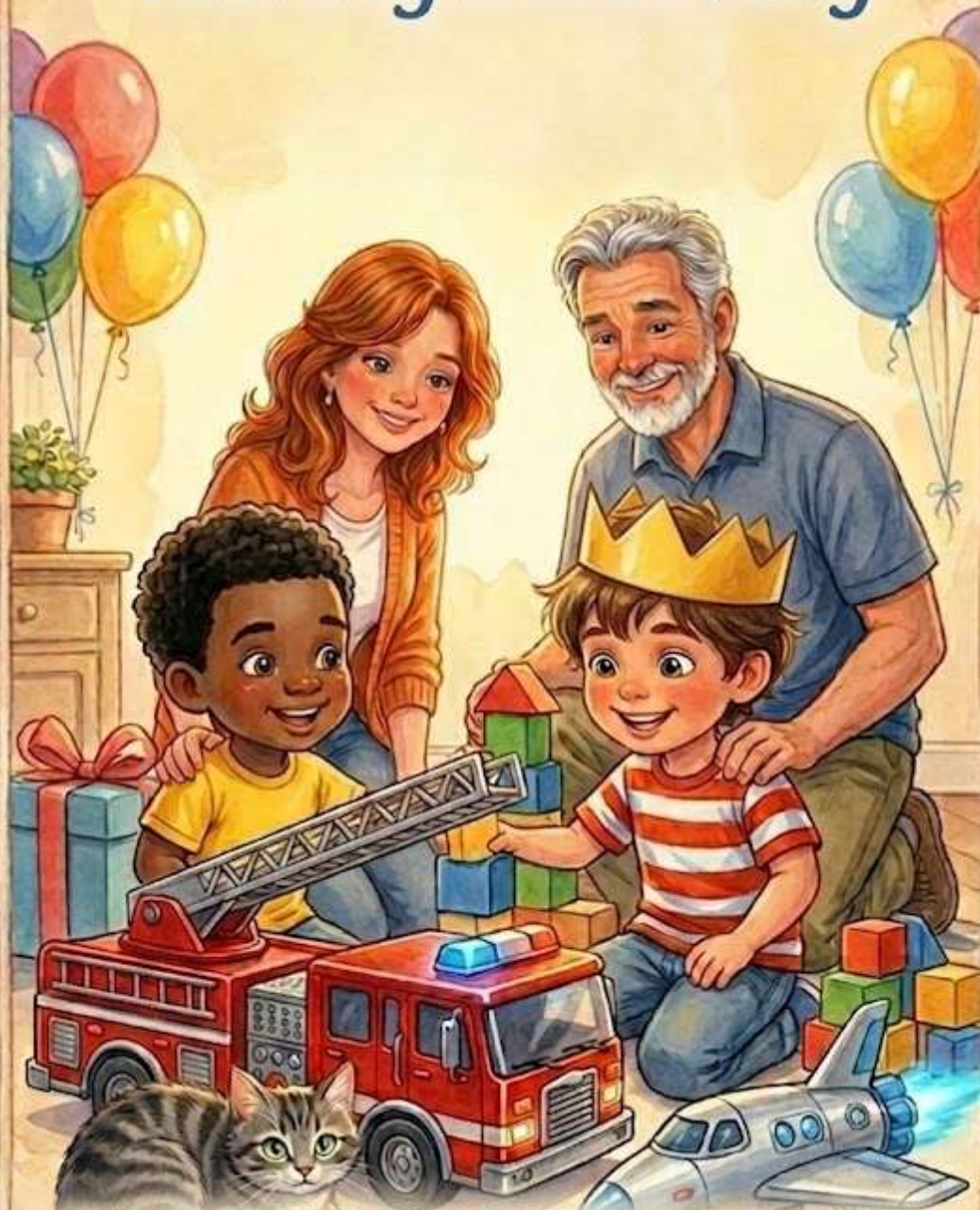
